# San Francisco Train Depot

Shortly after the 1906 earthquake and the fire that followed, the Western Pacific Railroad (WPR) acquired the property on Brannan Street. They built two new freight depots with rail lines that ran between the two buildings. WPR occupied the depots from 1909 to 1980 but, by 1957 they were no longer the sole residents. The buildings, with open floor plans and low rents, were the perfect location for furniture and design-center businesses, which occupied the warehouses up until 2014. In early 2015, the depots were deconstructed for new development making old growth Douglas Fir support beams available for new projects.
