The Story: Palomino Barn Wood

Horses, whiskey, tobacco and farming are at the core of the South's rich history – which is where our Palomino Barn Wood comes from. Mission Bell's Palomino Barn Wood is reclaimed from barns built from the 1800s up until the 1940s. Years of weathering have given this wood a unique silvery-grey luster.

Our Palomino Barn Wood conveys the warm tones and natural texture of three species: Tulip Poplar, Beech, and Pine. The Tulip Poplar is an exceptionally large tree that has a rich green, yellowish-tan, and grey coloring, creating a distinctive rainbow effect. Beech is a sandy-tan and the Pine is a deeper brown. Exposed to the elements for decades, each species has a beautifully rustic and timeless character. Each board is rough or circle sawn and has a medium to heavily textured grain.

The hardness and patina vary from one board to the next as a result of its exposure to a range of weather conditions. By incorporating these boards, you're adding a touch of all seasons: heat, rain and snow. The color and patina is achieved naturally, so no finishing is necessary. Our Palomino Barn Wood is ready to go when you are.

Like your favorite pair of jeans, this set of barn wood is both well-worn and comfortable. Build the next chapter of American history with the Palomino Barn Wood into your next project.
